

Patriot Program Requirements for First Grade

1. Complete at home. Create a poster (an 8.5"x11" piece of paper may be used) of a National Symbol. Include a photo or drawing of the symbol and two facts about it. Examples of National Symbols include The Liberty Bell, The Bald Eagle, The Rose, The Great Seal, etc. Write your first and last name on your poster the same way you would like it printed on your certificate of program completion.
2. Practice at home. Complete in school. Recite the Pledge of Allegiance using proper etiquette.

Face the Flag with your right hand over your heart.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag: "I pledge allegiance to the Flag of The United States of America, and to the Republic for which it stands, one Nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

3. Practice at home. Complete in school. What is the capitol of The United States of America?

4. Practice at home. Complete in school. Point to Washington D.C. on a blank map of The United States of America.



5. Practice at home. Complete in school. Who is the current President and Vice President of The United States?

6. Complete at home. Complete 1/2 hour of community service. This can be an activity of your choice, just make sure to discuss your plan with a grown-up first. Some ideas for community service include:

- Collect food, toys, clothes, books, towels, blankets, or other items and donate them to an organization in need.
- Rake leaves or shovel snow for a neighbor or family member.
- Pick up trash in your neighborhood or other area.
- Make Holiday cards or decorations and donate to a senior living facility.
- Write letters to of gratitude to servicemen and women. (Be sure not to include personal information other than your first name.)
- Bring a treat to the local sheriff's office or firehouse to show gratitude.

After you have completed your community service, fill out the community service form included in this packet and have an adult sign it. You may turn this in to your Patriot Program volunteer.
